1713-2013: The Peace of Utrecht Revisited

Historiographical debate and comparative studies

The Peace of Utrecht may be considered as the first time a political treaty was concluded which had a global impact. The peace not only ended a European-wide conflict, but also led to a cessation of hostilities on the American continent and Indian subcontinent, as well as naval warfare worldwide. Arguably therefore the event also marks an important step in the development of an integrated world-wide political system. This conference aims to reconsider the preconditions, negotiations and consequences of the Peace Treaties concluded in Utrecht in 1713. Rather than the prevailing research on international relations and diplomacy, the contributions aim to embed the Utrecht events in a broader context of diverging networks, globalizing empires, expanding media and changing identities. Analysing the impact of and interdependencies between economic, dynastic and confessional challenges a nationstate-based perspective of peace congresses, the highlighting of discursive and medial environments and strategies of diplomacy will work out the processes of making peace as cultural constructions and social practices in a world that differed so strikingly from the one of the Treaties of Westphalia.

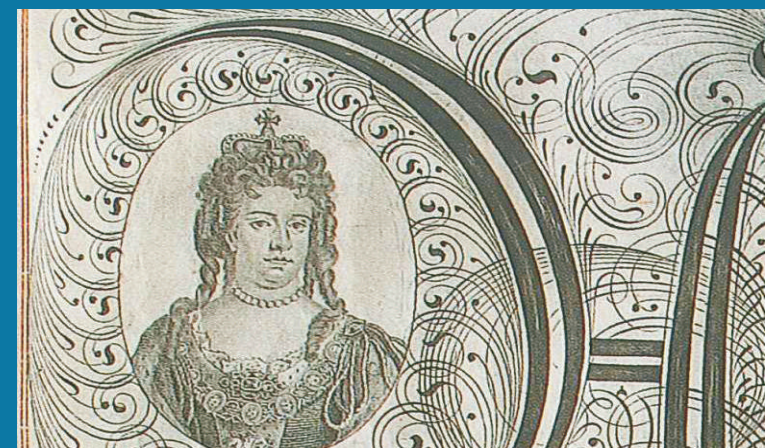

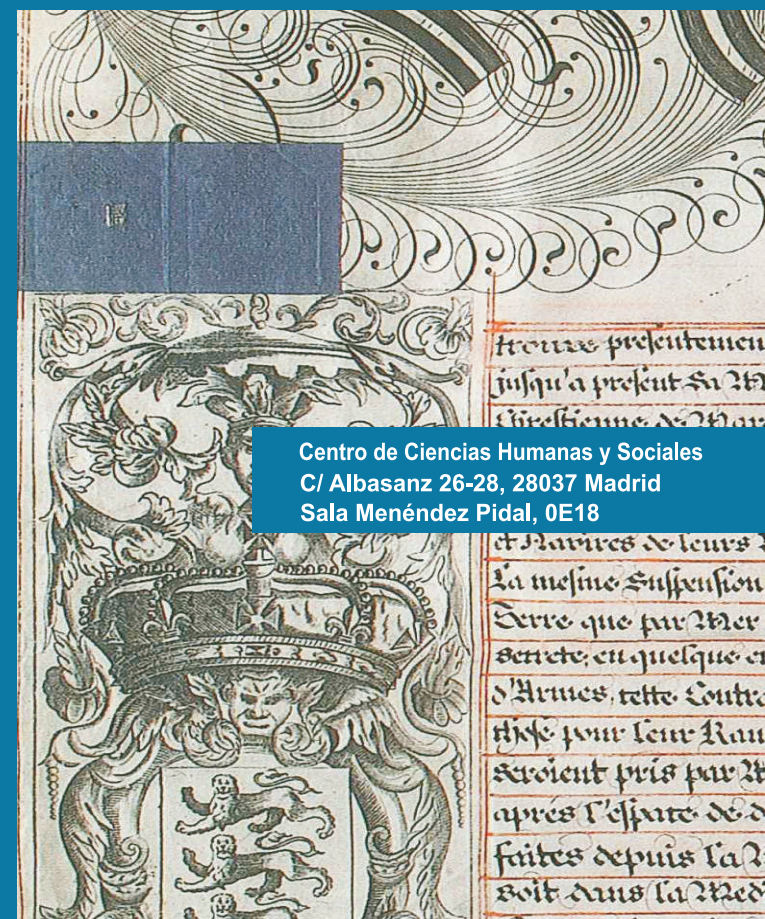
